<p>Beyond Hospitals – Where else do credentialing and privileging matter? (1 hour)</p> <p>Presenter: Cris Mobley</p>	<p>Credentialing/Privileging has become an expansive industry as we know. Opportunities for MSPs have greatly expanded, not only in multiple types of hospitals and non-hospitals, but the virtual world has opened up opportunities as well. This session will describe additional environments such as FQHCs/look alike, community health centers, ASCs, tribal clinics, and student health centers to name a few as well as who accredits them; e.g., HRSA, IHS, AAAHC, and more.</p>
<p>Move To A Three Year Reappointment Cycle: To Change Or Not To Change, That Is The Question?? (1 hour)</p> <p>Presenter: Janet Wilson</p>	<p>The Joint Commission recently revised their medical staff standards to allow for a three year schedule While many in the industry review this change as favorable, there are a multitude of decisions that must be made before this change should occur. In this program, we will discuss the pros and cons of transitioning to a reappointment period of three years, and discuss the regulatory, accreditation and governance document factors that will need to be evaluated and considered.</p>
<p>Are you Up to Date?? Accreditation Standards Updates for 2026 (1 hour))</p> <p>Presenter: Janet Wilson</p>	<p>There have been some updates to Accreditations Standards that affect our industry. During this session we will highlight and discuss the recent updates and compliance requirements.</p>
<p>Meet your new Co-Worker: AI in the MSO (1 hour)</p> <p>Chris Giles or Cris Mobley (or can co-present)</p>	<p>This is new territory for all of us. This session will explore AI use in the credentialing/privileging, and Medical Staff Services role looking at the possibilities and the risks of its use. Discussion will include some of the legal considerations that need to be determined as well as the cultural considerations and how to work towards acceptance of its use.</p>
<p>Silence is Risk: Recognizing and Responding to Red Flags (1-1.5 hours)</p> <p>Presenter: Cris Mobley</p>	<p>It’s one thing to collect data related to an application or reapplication. It’s another to be able to identify some of the “flags” raised when assessing that information once received. The more you experience you have processing files, the more you develop a “sixth sense” to know there’s something not quite right. This session will identify common and uncommon red flags that should be addressed and steps to take depending upon the nature of the information received.</p>

Are your processes for what you utilize documented in the bylaws and/or policy?</p>
<p>Ignore, Manage, Report?? How do you address physicians who resign with red flags?</p> <p>(1 hour)</p> <p>Presenter: Janet Wilson</p>	<p>Do you have physicians who resign with red flags in their file you are tracking/trending? Do you have a policy that requires you review/address red flags before allowing the physician to resign? Is there language in policy or bylaws that will not allow a practitioner to reapply for membership/privileges if they resigned with outstanding red flags in their file? Lets discuss best practices to consider.</p>
<p>Need to Know v. Good to Know – What <i>must</i> be verified and what should/could be verified in the credentialing process</p> <p>(1 hour)</p> <p>Presenter: Cris Mobley</p>	<p>Between accreditation standards, industry practice, state statutes and company policy, it's often confusing to know what <i>has to be verified</i> and where everything else comes from. Frequently, when asking people why they do something, it's either "because Joint Commission says so" or "because we've always done it that way." Both can be true OR maybe not. This session will discuss what the standards and regulations <i>require</i> in the credentialing process, with very few outliers, and what may be optional as well as make sense as our industry strives to check every nook and cranny to find out as much as possible about a new applicant.</p>
<p>VERIFY AND COMPLY: Credentialing across the Spectrum of Hospitals, Surgery Centers and Managed Care</p> <p>(3 hours)</p> <p>Presenter: Janet Wilson</p>	<p>As a former co-author of HCPro's Verify & Comply: Credentialing, Medical Staff, and Ambulatory Care Standards, Janet will share a comprehensive comparative review of all regulatory and accreditation standards. <p>Accreditation Standards and Industry Standards are NOT the Same – Know the Difference (1 - 1.25 hours) Presenter: Cris Mobley</p>	<p>Many people believe that because policies dictate how to process an application or reapplication, it is required by the accreditor and/or CMS. Not necessarily true. Much of what MSPs verify and/or collect during this process is due to "industry" standards because it makes sense. There is often confusion as to what's required and what is done to supplement the requirements. In this session, we will differentiate between the two, addressing "myths" about the origin of the processes we follow. You may be surprised!</p>
<p>Find Your Voice – Crucial Credentialing Discussions (1 hour) Presenter: Janet Wilson</p>	<p>In our role as medical services professionals, we are sometimes faced with the responsibility of initiating a crucial conversation with hospital leaders and medical staff leaders regarding problematic findings identified during the credentialing or peer review process. In this program we will share scenarios on how to prepare for crucial conversations, how to relay important information necessary to support an educated, not emotional decision by the hospital or medical staff leader and also how to be persuasive and provide influence, if necessary, to succeed in conversations with leaders.</p>
<p>From chaos to Clarity: Mastering Modern Meeting Techniques (1-1.5 hours) Presenter: Chris Giles</p>	<p>Explore the current tools available for ensuring that useful minutes are maintained for all relevant meetings. Communication skills are key – identifying what those skills are and how to utilize them when administering meetings. Meeting management is a skill – identify what additional abilities/techniques you need to become an experienced professional in meeting management.</p>
<p>Clinical Privileging and Competence Assessment in the Ambulatory Setting (1 hour) Presenters: Cris Mobley or Chris Giles</p>	<p>Many healthcare systems include ambulatory settings. If those settings are under your corporate umbrella – you need to ensure that privileging and assessment of competency is taking place and is meaningful. And if they are independent of a health system, competency assessment is still necessary.</p>

What should good privilege forms include and not include and what's the MSP's role in review/revision maintenance.</p>

<p>Reducing Organizational Exposure through Smarter Credentialing Practices</p> <p>(1 hour) Presenter: Chris Giles</p>	<p>Learn how to avoid legal and risk problems by establishing a risk assessment approach to the credentialing and privileging processes. Credentialing is not just a paper/information chase; it is the basis for reducing exposure of our patients to incompetent or unknowledgeable practitioners. It is necessary to be aware of the loopholes that some practitioners try to take to avoid being denied privileges or access to patients.</p>
<p>HR and Medical Staff Peer Review – Collaboration is Key to Assuring Patient Safety!!</p> <p>(1 hour) Presenter: Janet Wilson</p>	<p>The AMA recently reported, approximately 51% of physicians are employed. Unfortunately, an increasing number of physicians who are terminated by the employer (HR) for behavior or clinical quality problems are allowed to move freely to another practice with no concurrent or subsequent medical staff peer review action. We will discuss ideas, options and regulatory opportunities for a collaborative approach to peer review for employed physicians.</p>
<p>Navigating Physician Aging and Physician Re- Entry – Tricky but Doable</p> <p>1 hour Presenter: Cris Mobley</p>	<p>There are fewer and older physicians practicing today. Some have retired but coming back. An interesting dilemma in these times. Discussion will include potential associated risks with both, address policies that need to be in place, share valuable resources to assist organizations in assessing competency levels and review some actual case studies. I will include an overview of national re-entry trends, guidance on re-entry policies, review of approaches to facilitate an effective and safe transition onto the clinical staff and presentation of case studies</p>
<p>Credentialing Committee Vetting of State Medical Board Information: Applying the Right Diligence</p> <p>(60 minutes) Co Presenter: Janet Wilson</p>	<p>This session will highlight the importance and value of querying information from a state medical board in a manner which yields necessary information. In many cases it may not be sufficient to simply confirm whether an applicant has an active license. Attendees will learn that state medical boards are variable in the speed with which they post actions against licensees, the completeness of the information posted, the length of time in which they keep information posted on their websites, and the manner in which they alert those querying that there is additional information in board files.</p>
<p>Avoiding Negligent Credentialing – Strategies that Protect your Organization</p> <p>(1-1.5 hours) Presenter: Cris Mobley</p>	<p>No one wants to read about their organization in the headlines for a negligent credentialing lawsuit. So, how do you avoid credentialing risk in your organization?
